

Annual Conference 2024: Data-Driven Design

This year's conference, to be held at the University of Glasgow on the 4th and 5th of June, will consider, within the overarching theme of Data-Driven Design, how AI, data and technology are influencing and changing sustainable university design, in particular looking at how the University is responding to these challenges.
