1938 Empire Exhibition

MR Gray Laidlaw has given us a lovely reminder in his letter today of the enthusiastic joy engendered by the Empire Exhibition in Glasgow in 1938. Since my father and mother had much to do with the promotion of the exhibition, I can tell him, from our records, that 270 policemen and 40 detectives were on duty on the last night and only 23 visitors required their attention for minor offences; a further nine were drunk and 12 had breached the peace.

After 8pm rain fell incessantly but by 10pm 347,492 visitors had been recorded through the turnstiles. At the closing, the Voice of the Exhibition spoke out a farewell message – “I am the embodiment of all that has made for Glasgow a memorable achievement . . . I die tonight. May memories of me abide in your hearts”. It is splendid they do, especially the fact that the exhibition did not open on Sundays.
