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

PREFACE

Charles Rennie Mackintosh was born at No 70 Parson Street Glasgow on 7th June 1868 the second son of Police Superintendent William Mackintosh. He was a delicate boy one of a family of eleven and showed great ability as an artist from early days.

Mackintosh was determined to be an Architect from an early age. In 1884 when he was sixteen he entered as an apprentice the office of John Hutchison an Architect in Glasgow. At the same time he enrolled as an evening student at the Glasgow School of Art. Therefore while he was a student he was also executing work as an apprentice Architect.

Mackintosh then left Hutchison's firm in 1889 to join John Honeyman & Keppie Architects as an Architectural draughtsman in the same year. In 1884-1896 he worked only as an assistant to an Architect or designed under his guidance. However when the competition for the new Glasgow School of Art was held, he became an Architect in his own right at the early age of 28. Mackintosh became a partner officially in 1904 after the retiral of Honeyman. Ten years later he left the firm and Glasgow.

He worked in Chelsea from 1915-1923 and continued to make advances in modern architecture late into his career. However he retired from architectural works and from 1923-1927 devoted himself to painting at Port Vendres in the South of France.

He died on 10th December 1928 in London from cancer of the tongue.

Charles Rennie Mackintosh was obviously one of the great architectural pioneers at the turn of the century. But, his great contribution to the development of modern architecture, was not understood in Britain and he lived in obscurity at the end of his life.

This catalogue locates and classifies the existing architectural drawings from his school days to his final project (including one which was previously unknown) with a complete photographic record. These show clearly the great achievements of his architectural works and stylistic evolution.

They are notes of the cost of work and payments to firms employed, including estimates received from firms applying to undertake work.

The building designed by Andrew Black assistant of John Hutchison Howarth's book shows Mackintosh's drawing of an Ionic Capital which was executed in plaster. The building however was destroyed by fire in the early 1900s and no trace of the executed work remains

This drawing submitted for the Alexander Thomson Travelling Studentship which was awarded to Mackintosh.

The subject was an original design for a public hall for 1000 persons (seated) with suitable committee rooms the design to be early classic and on an isolated site. Mackintosh adopted the Ionic order and designed a symmetrical building set on a high base -it seems that he had mastered the use of orders perfectly at this stage.

This project was unpremiated and Mackintosh's first "for build" competition entry. Advertised on 20th Nov 1890 by the City of Glasgow Improvement Trust town clerk J D Marwich; closing date of the competition was 31st Dec 1890 allowing just five weeks for the design.

About this time Mackintosh gave a lecture on "Scotch Baronial Architecture" at the Glasgow Architectural Association just before his departure for travel to Italy. This relates interestingly to the design motto "Scottish Baronial" which was inscribed on his drawings. He had frequently sketched domestic architecture in the 1880s.

The competition for the proposed new building in Kelvingrove Park to cost about £120,000 was advertised by the Association for the promotion of Art & Music in the City of Glasgow in Sept 1891. Sixty two designs were submitted in December -Mr A Waterhouse R A assessor selected for the final competition those by Simpson & Allen Mr T M Deane, Malcolm Stark & Rowntree, Honeyman & Keppie (two designs) and Treadwell & Martin; these were submitted in the end of March 1892. The award was given to Simpson & Allen on 13th April 1892.

Honeyman & Keppie Architects sent three designs two of which were entered by Honeyman & Keppie themselves and one by Mackintosh. David Walker has pointed out his recognizable hand in the drawings particularly in the ornament penmanship and the detail design. The facade elevation with twin towers is the same conception as shown in the Italian sketch study of St Abondio at Como. He reused this facade on the Railway Terminus in 1892-1893 and also designed a Chapter House in which can be recognized the same combination of detail.

A T Bolton A R I B A was awarded the Soane Medallion for his design of a Railway Terminus (published in B A 13th Jan 1893 pp 19) The judges however made this comment on Mackintosh's entry "This design whether traditionally satisfying for a railway station or not has at all events much more conspicuous architectural merit than that which was selected for the first place in the competition. The great roof is frankly and agreeably expressed and there is a homogeneity and quality of proportion about the whole design which certainly did not distinguish the premiated design. North Park House was designed by J T Rochead and completed in 1871 by John Honeyman Mrs J Elder who with Mrs Campbell and others had been active in the movement to further the education of women bought North Park House in 1884 for use as a Medical College for women.

Nine years later (1893) Mrs Elder handed over the College and an endowment fund to the University. Honeyman & Keppie were formally commissioned with the design of the new Medical building in 1893 or the beginning of 1894 in the grounds of Queen Margaret's College. Funds to the extent of £5,000 were provided to the University Court by the Bellahouston trustees.

Mackintosh's perspective of the new building was published in the <u>B A</u> 10th Jan 1896 and in the <u>Academy</u> 1895.

A new Glasgow School of Art was proposed by Mr James Fleming chairman of the governors in a leading article for the Glasgow Herald (7 Mar 1895). About one year later another article in the Herald (26 Feb 1896)

"It is intended therefore to proceed soon with the new building a good central site for which had been secured on the adjoining plot of ground to the west of the present premises"

Shortly after this article the competition started the submission date for which extended until the 1st Oct 1896.

The construction was started in 1897; the Memorial Stone wqs laid on 25 May 1898. The School of Art first stage opened in Dec 1899 (It is likely at this time the building also included an extra wing of temporary technical studios west of the main building Basement floor; drawings were lodged with the D & G in June 1899).

The finished building however was not completed until 1906 as the Headmaster's room was furnished in 1904, the ground floor studio was changed into the Board room in 1906. (also see appendix,II)

According to Billcliffe Miss Catherine Cranston acquired the premises at 91-93 Buchanan St in 1895. The building was designed by George Washington Brown A R S A architect of Edinburgh and was published in B A on 28 Feb 1896. The construction was started in 1895. Miss Cranston entertained a party of her friends to dinner and showed them over her new establishment on 28 Apr 1897. On 3rd May her new Lunch and Tearooms were opened and attracted large crowds of visitors. George Walton together with Mackintosh was responsible for the decorations and furnishings. Mackintosh produced designs for stencilled decoration for the walls in the ladies room luncheon-room smoking room and possibly provided a design for the pendant light fittings

for the dining-room

The building was of four stories; at ground floor were the ladiesroom and general tea room; at first floor two other tea rooms; at second floor the luncheon room and diningroom; at the top floor were the billiard-room and smoking-room. Gleeson White described in Studio 1896 pp 92-97 "the ground colour of the wall on the first floor which Mackintosh has decorated is green the second a greyish greenish yellow and the upper blue the colour in each intruding as a frieze on the adjoining story . So that idea of earth to sky is preserved"

Billcliffe has given the date for Argyle Street Tea-rooms as 1897. Miss Cranston commissioned the Glasgow architects H & D Barclay to remodel the building with a completely new facade and the decoration for the Tea-rooms was provided by Mackintosh and G Walton. The ground floor was occupied by the tea-rooms; the first and Second floors by the luncheon-room and tea rooms; the top floor by Billiards-room Smoking-room and readingroom. From illustrations which survive it is hard to find a clear definition of the extent of either Walton's or Mackintosh's decoration. However Mackintosh was responsible for the furniture and furnished both the Smoking-room and Billiard-room. The lighting over the billiard tables and his drawings suggest that he designed other light fittings.

'The Dutch Kitchen' Mackintosh had total control of the design for the Dutch Kitchen which was made into a new tea-room in the basement in 1905-06 He designed a strong motif for the decoration of the room which comprised the black and white squared pattern black open timber work and mosaic work.

According to Howarth the 120 Mains Street flat was photographed by Annan in March 1900 and the pictures published in Studio 1901.

The flat consisted of four mainrooms sharing some general principles.

The dining-room contrasted white frieze, ceiling with the dark colour of the wall below the picure-rail while all the woodwork was dark-stained pine, beeswaxed, with grey-brown paper on the walls. In the bedroom the walls and woodwork were in one tone of white relieved both by green panels in the broad frieze rail and by richly embroidered bed-hangings and curtains also by glass jewels in the ornament of the bed the mirror and the wardrobe. The studio room was designed to be seen from the eye-level of a seated person. In the drawing room the walls were covered with slightly grey canvas and all the woodwork was enamelled white. The carpet was grey. The ceiling lamps were made of silver profusely set with purple glass ornaments. The mantelpiece was in white enamelled wood; the grate was of polished steel and its back of white cement. Mackintosh's flat shows many new decoration

schemes.

The competition of <u>Haus Eines</u> Kunstfreundes was announced in the Zeitschrift fur Innendekoration Dec 1900 the deadline of entry was set for 25 Mar 1901

The 36 projects entered were judged on the 16-17 May at Darmstadt by 8 judges (Olrich Alex Koch Von B Vaendas H Christiansen F Putzer J Grabner H Schliepmann and Mackintosh's friend J Hofmann) The particular purpose was to contribute solutions to questions confronting modern architecture. The first prize of 8,000 marks however was not awarded to anyone and the sum was divided among many more than 16 competitors. The highest prize 1,800 marks (second prize) was awarded to Baillie Scott the third prize was divided into prizes of 600 and 120 marks awarded to Leopold Baure Oskar Marmorek and Paul Zeroch. Mackintosh's entry Der Vogel was

disqualified from the competition because he failed to submit the required number of Interior perspectives. On 22 June 1903 the first meeting between the School Board and Mackintosh, representing his office, took place.

for example on 2 Nov. 1904 he strongly recommended the use of white Dullatur stone instead of red sandstone which was eventually used. The tile contractor complained of the unusual character of the tile work including the use of black tiles but the School Board decided against black tiles and would accept no responsibility for other special tiles ordered by architect.

The total cost of the building had been about £14,740. J. Montgomery was clerk of works.

According to Billcliffe in 1903-1904 the client invited Mackintosh to redecorate the interiors of Hous'hill. The works were carried out in 1904-1905 The job-book started in May 1904. Photographs of the Dining-room, Blue Bedroom, the Dining room and White Bedroom were published in The Studio Year Book of Decorative Art 1907. The Billiards room, hall and vestibule were specified in the job-book but no photographs were published. Later another room was made, the Card Room, and one of the drawings for the firegrate include the initials of the client and the date 1909. The job-book indicates the work was carried out in 1909. Hous'hill caught fire on July 1934, and was bought and demolished by Glasgow Corporation.

Mossyde was designed for Major H.B. Collins, one of Mackintosh's previous clients. He had designed a gate lodge at Auchenbothie in 1901 and made alterations for Auchenbothie Mains in 1911-1913. Mossyde is a large Scottish style house with thick rubble walls, designed and built in three separate stages. The first stage, a ploughman's cottage, was of two storeys and 25'9" square, a tiny tower house and was probably built in later 1906 or beginning of 1907 (completed in late 1907 - early 1908). Shortly afterwards the second stage was built and gave on L-shaped plan to the Cloak Cottage. This sizeable addition with alterations was started in 1908 and was probably completed in 1910. For the third stage of Mossyde a tower wing was designed three storeys high with crow-stepped gables but this was not executed. 78 Derngate is of four storeys - a small Victorian terrace house in the centre of the town which Mackintosh completely remodelled and also designed much of the furniture. The design was already started before the D of G drawing was handed in for building control on 1 June 1916. The Arts League of Service consisted of a group of professional artists. On 23rd May 1919 the founding meeting was held at Margaret Morris's studio where a large number of artists were present.

Mackintosh noted in his diary that on 31 March 1920 he was instructed to prepare a scheme of the building for them.

The plans were submitted to the local authority in June after they were approved by a committee of the Arts LeagueofService. However eventually the project was abandoned due to problems of planning permission. Ecclesiastical Commissioners also objected to the studio block. The project was ambitious- the plans

provided two buildings one on Glebe Place and the other called "Cheyne House" on upper Cheyne Row(to rear of Glebe Place).

The first scheme is very interestingthe concept was on a vast scale with a complex butterfly plan and central courtyard and was possibly designed for a different site.

Later a much simpler scheme was adopted for the Cheyne House block.




58-A Elevation of sideboard wall and door wall March 1919.






59-B Plan of Ground and Upper floor. 1919.







John Honeyman the third son of John Honeyman J. P. 21 Carlton Place, Glasgow was born in Glasgow on the 11 August 1831. He was educated at Merchiston, Glasgow University and apprenticed to Alex Munro, a local architect. Honeyman practised chiefly as an ecclesiastical and domestic architect and wrote and published many papers on architectural, archaeological, social, economic and sanitary subjects. He was elected a Royal Scottish Academician in 1895 and a Fellow of the Royal Institute of British Architects in 1874. He was for many years a member of the council of R.I.B.A. and took an active part in popularising the Institute in Scotland. He became variously President of the G.I.A., the Glasgow Archaeological Society, one of the Governors of the Glasgow and West of Scotland Technical College and a member of the Glasgow Art Club. He took John Keppie into partnership in 1889 and retired from his firm in 1904. He died at Bridge of Allan in 1914.

JOHN KEPPIE (1862-1945)



John Keppie, the son of James Keppie a Tobacco Importer, was born at Glasgow in 1862. He was educated in Ayr Academy, Glasgow University, the Ecole de Beaux Arts in Paris (Atelier Pascal) Keppie was chief draughtsman to James Sellars before he joined John Honeyman in partnership in 1889. He gained two Silver Medals from the Royal Institute of British Architects. He was elected a President of the Architectural Association in Glasgow and President of the Glasgow Art Club. He also travelled widely in Europe.






5-B St.Thomas Church, 1892. Plan of Gallery. Drawing from D of G. Col : S.R.C.G.



5-C St. Thomas Church, 1892. Elevations and Sections. Drawing from D of G. Col : S.R.C.G.





These drawings were dated April and May 1902. At this time Mackintosh and Newbery were in Turin organising the Scottish contribution to the Exhibition of Medern Decorative Art. Billcliffe suggests the date April 1902 for their visit. Although Mackintosh did not execute the drawings himself the design is very much in his manner. It consists of an L-shape plan with a long corridor distinctive wood work and the recurring interest in a hill top site for a house reminiscent of Windyhill and Hill House.

The author believes that his design for the 'A House at Kilmacolm' (39-A-D) was the same project as this house having a similar plan scale position of windows and chimnies and the same site conditions of a gentle slope down from North to South. There is a difference in the style of the elevations between the designs similar to that which occurred in the early design for the Art School North elevation or the Gate Lodge at Auchenboth of Kilmacolm.

After the drawings were lodged at the D of G Court in May 1902 Mackintosh probably made slight alterations in the plan and changed the elevation which he drew himself at the later date of Dec 1902








I-A A Library room Elevation, four sides of room c. 1894-c.1897






II -B Plan of Ground floor




II -D (52-J(b)) Plan of Ground floor Nov. 1910






III-C Section C-D, A-B and North, West and South Elevations April 1902


Plan of Ground floor










Section thro Entrance Hall




Elevation of Janitor's Box, Section thor. Janitor's Box and Stair, Entrance Hall



Plan of Ceiling, First floor and Second floor




Plan of Ceiling, Plan of Balcony floor




Plan of Ground floor








Front Door Elevation and Section





Plan of Basement and Ground floors




Plan of First and Second floors




Plan of Third and Fourth floors




Plan of Fifth floor and Roof





Elevation to St. Vincent Lane




Elevation to Renfield Lane






Plan of Ground floor, Janitor's House




Plan of Ground floor Mezzanine






Plan of Second floor and Roof Plan






North Elevation and Analysis drawing








Detail of Stair Tower








Detail Elevation, South Facade west side



Plan of Ground floor




Plan of First floor




Plan of Attic floor


