The aim of the UNDA *Strengthening national capacities for sustainable housing in selected countries with economies in transition* project is to support countries with economies in transition (Armenia, Republic of Moldova, Serbia and Tajikistan) by assisting their national governments in the formulation and implementation of relevant policies and by developing the National Action Plans (NAPs) for Sustainable Housing, Urban Development and Land Management.

The **3-day workshop** will discuss approaches to the preparation, implementation and monitoring of the strategic documents and NAPs.

Participants will include international organizations' experts, national project coordinators and project consultants, representatives of the Ministry of Construction, Transport and Infrastructure of the Republic of Serbia and of Serbian municipalities, as well as academics and NGOs.

Day 1 will be dedicated to a general discussion of the methodological approaches and content of the strategic documents in the field of housing, urban planning and land management. The experts will cover development, implementation and monitoring aspects. National project coordinators will also report on their progress towards the preparation of NAP, implementation and monitoring activities.

Day 2 will be devoted to the case study on the implementation and monitoring of the NAP of the Republic of Serbia.

Day 3 will be a half-day interactive session aimed at discussing the participants' achievements and challenges in the implementation and monitoring of the NAPs and the next steps in the realization of the project.

In the aftermath of the workshop, NAPs will be updated by the national project consultants in accordance with the recommendations.
