Are you concerned about sustainability and environmental issues?



Changing Urban Nomads' Behaviours with Mass-produced Furniture through Emotional Durability Design

Invitation

You are being invited to take part in this research project exploring the role of Emotional Durability Design in mass-produced furniture for people who move from city to city, such as Glasgow, due to future opportunities, who this study refers to as *urban nomads*. This research is part of a Masters of Research programme based at The Glasgow School of Art.

What is this project about?

With increased awareness of the importance of sustainability and the circular economy, which tries to reduce any unnecessary waste in the production of products to zero, product longevity is becoming more valued. Emotional Durability Design (EDD) is considered to be an effective way to extend the life of the product by establishing an emotional connection between the user and the product.

Considering the connection between furniture waste in Glasgow and the temporary purchase and use of furniture by urban nomads, this study is trying to understand the potential role of emotional durability in urban nomad's daily life to challenge current actions. This aims to inform a dialogue between urban nomads and mass-produced furniture designers to explore its value to a more sustainable mass-manufactured furniture industry.

Why should I be a part of the project?

You are invited to be a part because you are meet key criteria of urban nomads, and your experience and knowledge can bring valuable insights to this research, which will support the development and application of EDD in the circular economy, and contribute to the sustainable development of the mass-produced furniture industry, even society.

What does the project involve?

If you decide to participate, you will be interviewed remotely online. You may then be asked if you would like to participate in two later stages of focus groups and co-design workshops. Agreeing to be interviewed does not commit you to any later stages of the research.

Interview

At this stage, we will conduct an online one-to-one semi-structured interview. I hope to hear the story between you and your furniture. For example, what kind of emotional connections do you think you have with different pieces of furniture? How does emotion affect the relationship between users and furniture? How could we change user behaviours with furniture? The amount of detail you choose to provide is up to you. You will never be asked to share information that you don't want to.

At later stages of this research, you may be invited to take place in further activities. These are presented here for your interest and your consent to participate would be requested again once the details for these activities can be provided.

Focus group

At this stage, you would share your experience of the connection with furniture in a group, and discuss the value and significance of emotional durability.

Co-creation

At this stage, you would design furniture together with other participants based on a brief formed at the focus group stage and evaluate the role of EDD in this process and its potential value to the circular economy.

What tools will be used?

The interview will use the video conferencing software Zoom (https://zoom.us/), with a secure Pro account. This means each session can be safely recorded and stored securely using the Zoom platform.

The focus group and workshop engagement tools will also be carried out online using Miro. The information shared at Miro will remain private, except for the participants.

Will my taking part be kept confidential?

Yes. Your participation will be kept entirely confidential except to me and my supervisors.

How will this happen?

With your consent, I will record a video of our online interview. You can also choose to turn off your camera during recording. The video and audio files will only be accessible by myself and my supervisors at The Glasgow School of Art, and will not be made public.

Focus group

This process will use both Zoom and Miro, as engagement tools.

Co-creation

At this stage, you would design furniture together with other participants based on a brief formed at the focus group stage and evaluate the role of EDD in this process and its potential value to the circular economy. This process will mainly use Miro as engagement tools.

What tools will be used?

The interview will use the video conferencing software Zoom (https://zoom.us/), with a secure Pro account. This means each session can be safely recorded and stored securely using the Zoom platform.

For our collaborative work in focus group and co-creation workshop, we will be using an online tool called Miro (https://miro.com/). This tool will create a virtual whiteboard where we can work together. The whiteboard will be secure and will only be shared with other participants during the work process.

After we have completed our work, I will further restrict sharing to myself only to ensure that your information is secure.

Will my taking part be kept confidential?

Yes. Your participation will be kept entirely confidential except to me and my supervisors.
