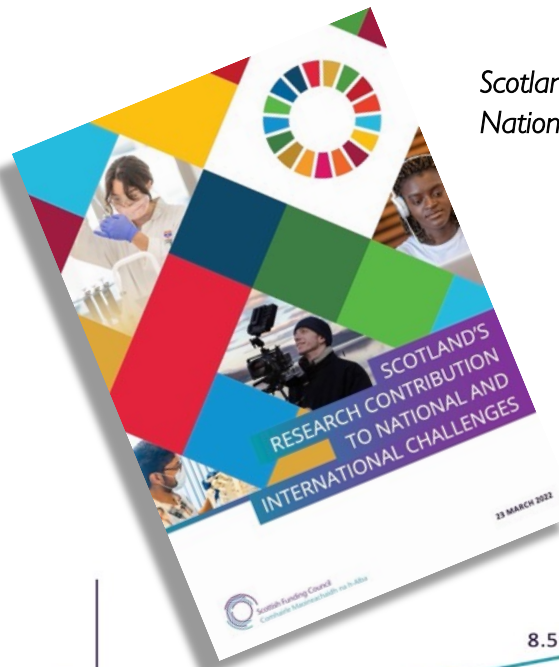

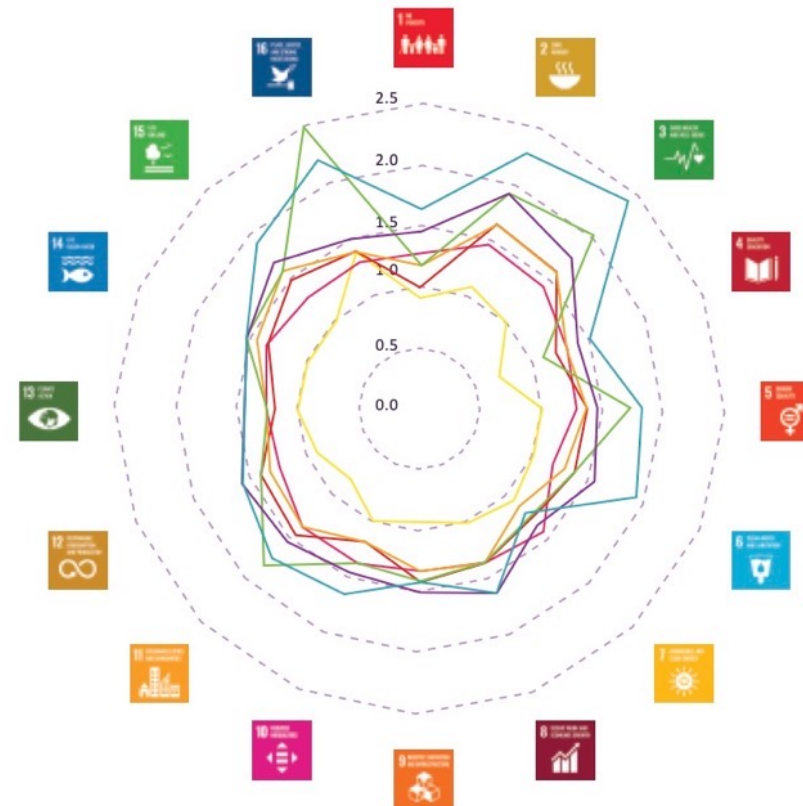


Scotland's Research Contribution to National and International Challenges

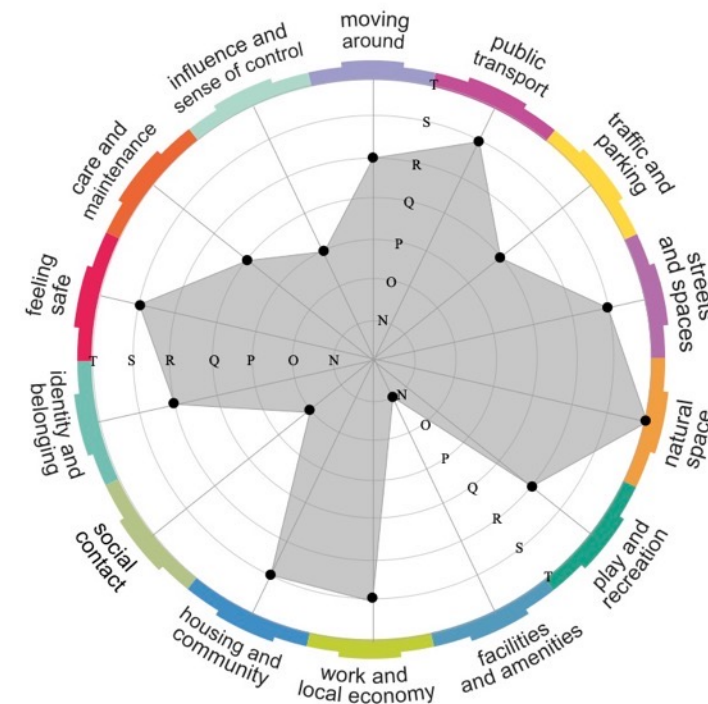

UNECE

- ❑ Progress with the SDGs and Targets requires ***simultaneous delivery*** of international, national, region, city and community action
- ❑ Delivery requires ***systemic and integrated coordination*** that focuses financial, housing, planning, health, transport and energy systems on ***place and life***
- ❑ We require feedback loops vertically (between levels) and horizontally (across systems)
- ❑ Housing is the key to delivery of ***place and life*** (plan and reality)
